Of interest. (Taken from September's WA Bird Notes)

Two species of raptors showing major decreases in frequency of sightings in Metro area; Black-shouldered Kites and Nankeen Kestrels.

Carnaby's Cockatoos showed a 59% decline in sightings while sightings of Ringnecks declined by 65% in Metro area due to localised competition from Rainbow Lorikeets. Rainbow Lorikeets are already a severe pest to fruit and grape growers.

A pest parrot strategy is being developed by DPIRD to try to stop further spread.
