NEW BAIT MIX FOR THE CHITTERING VALLEY FERAL PIG PROGRAM

Pigs can sometimes be fussy eaters depending on the time of the year and food availability in their habitat. It is a matter of trying several bait types to ensure success in drawing them into the trap.

In Chittering, it can also depend on what they are feeding on at the time. For example, in the orange orchards, feeding out unsaleable fruit can also attract the pigs.



ORIGINAL MIX

1. Barley grain soaked in a mix of water and molasses or
2. Crushed lupins, or
3. Corn soaked in water

NEW MIX

1. Barley grain soaked in water and vanilla essence solution.
2. Horse muesli soaked in water
3. Soaked lupins in water and molasses.
4. Barley grain and marshmallows.

The most successful bait is the barley and molasses mix.
